

OUR SCHOOL MISSION

The four campuses of the Catholic Academy of Bridgeport provide a Christ-centered, academically rigorous learning environment where cultural diversity is welcomed and celebrated. Students are nurtured, encouraged and challenged in preparation for a successful life of leadership and service.

OUR STUDENT MISSION

I am a Catholic Academy of Bridgeport student. I am worthy of the love of God. I am worthy of an excellent education. I am worthy of respect from my classmates and teachers. I recognize my obligation to return that respect and to reflect the light of Christ by living a successful life of leadership and service to others.



As Bishop of the Diocese of Bridgeport and Chair of the Board of the Catholic Academy of Bridgeport, we are celebrating 20 years in our '24/'25 Annual Report.

Through the leadership of an independent Board, since 2004 CAB has enhanced its financial strength and broadened its wide-ranging impact on Bridgeport students. Twenty years ago:

- 75% of our students were Catholic. Today, 50% are.
- 65% of our students identified as People of Color. Today, 92% do.
- 60% of our families required financial assistance totaling \$500k a year. Today, 96% do, and over \$3.3MM is awarded in assistance. All of this funding comes from the contributions of individual donors and private foundations.

From all ethnic backgrounds and socioeconomic situations, our 880 PreK-8 students flourish within our highly faith-based and academically rigorous environment.

CAB continues to underwrite 70% of the cost of each student's education. Doing so necessitates that we keep expenses down while still rewarding the fine work of our personnel. Executive Director Angela Pohlen's Success Pay initiative is just the formula. Our teachers assure that all of their students, even the most academically challenged, are performing to the best of their abilities. In subjects where progress is slow, teachers redouble their efforts to help students remain on track. In return, we are compensating teachers more fairly and in accordance with their individual achievements in the classroom.

Donors appreciate that a CAB education costs less than 40% of that of Bridgeport public or charter schools, and that any enhancements that they help to finance are monitored and measured for success. We thank our committed donors for investing in Success Pay and the miracles performed by our 90+ faculty and staff members every school day.

CAB was built on the shoulders of giants: past Board members, committee heads and chairpersons, major donors, key diocesan personnel and, most importantly, our students and their families who have done the hard work to make a CAB education as effective as it is. As we start the countdown to our 25th anniversary in '29/'30, we remain committed to the long-term financial resilience of CAB, to funding further enrollment growth and to creating even broader academic offerings. We promise all of this as we remain fully committed to our faith-based mission in changing the lives and hopes of Bridgeport youth on a large scale.

Investing in our faculty with this merit-based program resulted in zero turnover of our classroom teachers for the fall of 2025.



OPENING THE HAPPY HOLLOW OUTDOOR LEARNING CENTER (HHOLC) ON OUR ST. RAPHAEL CAMPUS

Through generous grants and individual donations, we transformed an area filled with cracked concrete and outdated plastic playscapes into a dynamic, safe learning environment that features sensory play areas, an outdoor classroom, age-appropriate playground equipment, and a sports court. The space is also now used to support year-round programming.

“Since the opening of the HHOLC, the number of office referrals for disciplinary matters has declined from five per week to two per month. Students are gaining the tools they need to better manage their emotions and better manage social conflict. CAB's Student Success Program hits 5-year mark

The '24/'25 school year marked the fifth year since the launch of this transformative initiative.

Led by social workers on each of CAB's four campuses, the Student Success Program (SSP) is a systematic and holistic approach to intervention taken to assess and address individual student academic and behavioral needs. From minor short-term interventions to significant permanent accommodations, the SSP allows CAB to expertly partner with parents to help each child access their education and find real success. Individualized written plans are created to provide a platform to set and track measurable goals for students and address both strengths and challenges that maybe impacting a student's success, including academics, behavior, and social-emotional and developmental factors.

The SSP helped more than 100 students find success in and out of the classroom in '24/'25 while ultimately building a stronger sense of community throughout the entire Academy. Partial funding for the program was provided by grants from foundations such as the Duchesne Fund for Ministry and Near & Far Aid, among others.



CAB's SSP goals directly align with our mission, as well as our investment in the holistic needs of our community at large. We seek to increase our proficiency in this area and meet an ever-widening scope of student needs in the years ahead, thereby giving the lifelong and transformative gift of a faith-filled and rigorous education to every deserving student.

FRUITS OF CAB'S SSP INCLUDE:

- Improved social, emotional and academic outcomes for our students.
 - Increased positive interactions between teachers and students.
 - Increased collaboration and partnership between the school and our families.
 - An increase in student independence and their ability to advocate for themselves.
 - An increase in student retention.
- According to our campus social workers, **at least 10% of our student population, who would otherwise have to leave CAB were it not for the SSP and the efforts of our social workers, have been able to stay and be served successfully on campus.**




Rising Stars Student Sponsorship Program

This initiative offers individual donors the opportunity to contribute toward the education of a student at CAB each year, helping us bridge the gap between the true cost to educate a child at our school vs. what our families can actually afford to pay.

\$1MM Challenge Match

Fundraising toward the Sr. Joan Magnetti Endowed Scholarship Fund kicked off in '24/'25, thanks to the vision and generosity of longtime donor Frank Sica. We have already raised \$375k toward our \$1MM goal.

Success Pay

This teacher compensation program has been incredibly successful, rewarding excellence in teaching based on merit rather than longevity. We have raised \$1.83MM in gifts or pledges toward our 10-year goal of \$4MM to fund the program by AY '31/'32.

A ROADMAP FOR THE NEXT 20 YEARS

On the heels of our 20th Anniversary, we are now planning for our 25th. Our goal is to ensure the viability of our school well into the future, while remaining committed to our mission: to serve PreK through 8th-grade girls and boys from Bridgeport in a nurturing, safe, academically rigorous and faith-filled environment.

KEY AREAS OF FOCUS

GROWING OUR ENDOWMENT, BRIDGING THE GAP

CAB's endowment is an active source of funding for tuition coverage, teacher Success Pay, facilities improvements and more. As educational costs continue to rise and family contributions cover a diminishing share of our expenses, having a robust endowment is essential in helping to ensure a strong future.

Cultivating support within our community and beyond will continue. Recent successes in areas outside of Fairfield County are already helping to fuel this goal, as are meaningful efforts to grow our alumni outreach and more deeply engage CAB grads.

BROADENING OUR SUPPORT BASE

OFFERING MORE MULTI-FACETED GIVING OPTIONS

In addition to our most popular giving opportunities to scholarship and endowment, gifts to other important areas — such as to academic programs, the Arts, athletics and professional development — will be offered so CAB can thrive for decades to come.

As more student applicants come to us who have special learning challenges, we will provide increased on-campus resources to these children so they can find success on campus and no longer have to be referred out, in many cases, to public schools for these services.
