


#### Dr. Frank P. Cammisa to be honored at CAB Fall Gala

It is with great joy and gratitude that the Academy will honor Dr. Frank P. Cammisa, Jr. on October 23 at 6 PM at Woodway Country Club in Darien. As a devoted student sponsor through CAB's Rising Stars program, a key supporter of major events and an advocate of the endowment, Dr. Cammisa has changed countless lives in Bridgeport through the years. He also has had tremendous impact professionally as a spine surgeon. He is Chief Emeritus of Spine Service at Hospital for Special Surgery and a Professor of Surgery at Weill Cornell Medical College. Dr. Cammisa is a graduate of Tufts University and Columbia University College of Physicians and Surgeons, and is credited with introducing many innovative techniques, such as total disc replacement as an alternative to spinal fusion surgery. He has led extensive research in many areas of spine surgery and founded the Integrated Spine Research Program at HSS. He is on the medical staff of the New York Giants and New York Mets, and is a consultant to the National Hockey League Players Association. He lives in Greenwich and has three grown children: Annie, Trey and Jack. # CAB Founding Board Chair Larry Bossidy dies at age 90


It is with great sadness that we share the passing of our Founding Board Chair, Larry Bossidy, on July 22. Bossidy served from 2004-2009 and helped to expand the Board's depth and breadth. He was also instrumental in launching a transformative endowment fund, overseeing significant structural repairs to aged buildings and ensuring important modern technology was added to classrooms. These improvements allowed CAB to better compete with local public and magnet schools while helping students be best prepared for high school and beyond. Because



of this foresight, CAB remains a beacon of hope and light in the city of Bridgeport today. Bossidy will long be remembered for his distinguished five-decade career, which included 34 years at the General Electric Company where he rose to the position of Vice Chairman, and subsequent years as Chairman and CEO of AlliedSignal and Honeywell. He also co-authored several best-selling books. Perhaps Bossidy's biggest success, though, was his beautiful family. Larry Bossidy's legacy will forever live on in the hearts and minds of CAB Board members, faculty, staff and students.








## Summer programs filled with learning and fun

## ALUMNI SPOTLIGHT Brendan D. Bernard '10

Sergeant US Army, Infantry

Brendan graduated from CAB's St. Andrew campus in 2010. He then went on to Fairfield Prep, where he was an AP and Honors student and graduated Cum Laude. He went on to Fairfield University where he graduated Magna Cum Laude in 2018 with a B.A. in Political Science and a minor in Philosophy. Today, Brendan is a Sergeant in the U.S. Army Infantry Division at Ft. Irwin, a national training center in the Mojave desert, where he has been for the last

five years. He has received four Army Achievement Medals. Soldier of the Month, Soldier of the Quarter, 2nd Place Soldier of the Year (out of 5,000 people on the base), and a Silver Medal for the German Field Standards Competition. "In hindsight, transitioning to high school was easy. The learning experiences and culture at St. Andrew helped me a lot more than other kids from public schools. I was very well prepared. The education I received was high quality and it set me above others in high school...I still remember Ms. Young, my 1st-grade teacher. She engaged with the kids and was hands on. She also was similar to my mom, including with discipline. She maintained high standards of behavior and morality, and balanced discipline with a caring atmosphere." Most impactful overall, in Brendan's view, was the school's fostering the spiritual element. "We had Mass every First Friday, religion classes and learned the philosophy and morality behind what we believe. Being diligent with your work in class was important, as was learning selfdiscipline. Standards were high and spiritual guidance kept me on track. I saw others outside of my school without those things who got off track. And faith is still important to me." What is Brendan's advice for parents considering a CAB campus for their child? "Ask yourself, 'What do you envision for their future?' It has to start at home. School should be an extension of home. For high standards for education success and learning, CAB is second to none, head and shoulders above any public school. Kids are far too easily distracted today, and need the culture of personal discipline found here. Motivation, discipline, a consistent foundation of morality and discipline at school and at home - all of these are important and you will find here." Brendan is not the only Bernard family member to go on and achieve success. All of his five older siblings attended CAB campuses, and his mother, Peaches (pictured below right), is a long-time beloved Middle School Teacher on the St. Augustine campus.
