Welcome

As Bishop of the Diocese of Bridgeport and Chair of the Board of the Catholic Academy of Bridgeport, we are pleased to share with you our Annual Report for the 2022-2023 academic year.

The Catholic Academy of Bridgeport continued to provide a high-quality education to our PreK-8 students and their families this year. Enrollment grew to 900+ students from a recent high of 892 the year before, and we provided \$2.8M in funds for need-based student financial assistance, which was flat on last year. All told, the Academy underwrote, on average, 70% of the cost of each of our student's education. We remain committed to never refusing admission to a student due to financial hardship.

Under Executive Director Angela Pohlen's leadership, our new Merit Pay initiative was launched this year. Seven teachers completed their portfolios and presented their evidence of mastery before panels that included Angela, the campus principal, a Board member, a colleague advocate and, often, a parent. While the financial investment needed to fully implement Merit Pay in the years ahead is significant, the teacher advancement and pay benefits of the program will ensure that we attract the finest teachers available within a very tight hiring environment.

With salary, utilities, insurance and other operating costs on the rise, the Academy has had to start passing along some increased costs to our student families. Family contributions have been held flat since prior to the COVID pandemic but are critical to ongoing operations. Our families understand this reality, and are fully committed to investing what they can alongside us to best educate their children. CAB's cost to educate one of its student's remains extremely low at \$7,000 a year, roughly a third of that at Bridgeport public or charter schools.

We aspire to make a CAB education truly unique, not just 'good for Bridgeport' but on par with private and public schools elsewhere in Fairfield County. Our Board and staff members will ensure the success of CAB's cost-effective and scalable mission, and will continue to provide an exceptional faith-based education for our students. With your increased support and prayers, we will change the lives of thousands of Bridgeport students in the years to come.





EXECUTIVE DIRECTOR ANGELA POHLEN TALKS ACCESS & Opportunity

In '22-'23, we built on the strengths of our community and championed our tagline, "*Something More.*"

Providing on-campus access to the Performing Arts took center stage last year, with the launch of our new Alegre Program for the Performing Arts. Drama, dance, and choir were offered to students in 6th-8th grade, with 50 participants this initial year. Each semester culminated with a Performing Arts Festival where students showcased jazz and tap routines, short-form stage acts, and choral pieces with multi-part harmonies. CAB is grateful to Jim Colica and his late wife, Kathy, for underwriting this initiative.

Also available to CAB students were over 40 new or longtime-favorite after-school activities. There was something for everyone and all grade levels — from Chess Club, Art Club and Robotics, to Basketball, Cheerleading, and Ping Pong.







Cultivating meaningful partnerships — both externally and internally — were key to our growth and success in this past year. This included:

Advocating for school choice and promoting the value of Catholic school education by attending legislative breakfasts and writing timely editorials that were published across several Hersam Acorn media outlets.

Remaining committed to Social-Emotional Learning and building on the strengths of our Student Success Program through new grant awards to better serve our students and their families.

Opening the Christopher Ripp Early Learning Program on our St. Raphael campus to offer physical, academic, spiritual, and cultural enrichment to students after school along with monthly parent education sessions.

Hosting Board, staff and faculty retreats to build culture and connection, while providing forums for strategic planning and soliciting feedback. We even provided our faculty with "emergency provisions" during Teacher Appreciation Week!

Opening access to our Jump Start summer enrichment program to students from *all* CAB campuses in grades 4–8.

Expanding our students' minds through dynamic field trips and on-site experiences — from a visit to the The Ecology School in Saco, ME, to a visit from a petting zoo, and so much more.

Exceeding Merit Pay Expectations

After unanimous Board and faculty approval, CAB proudly implemented an innovative Merit Pay program in July 2022. The result? 100% of our faculty are now paid closer to what their public-school counterparts make, and the pay scale is based on competency rather than longevity. By June 2023, teacher turnover notably dropped while reported job satisfaction grew.

Seven teachers deemed ready to jump to a new level of mastery by their principals spent the year putting together comprehensive portfolios and providing evidence of professional competency at their aspiring levels. They then presented their evidence of mastery to a panel that included

their principal, a Board member, and a colleague, among others. With their new titles, each received a significant salary increase as they now work toward meeting their next set of educator goals. CAB is grateful to *every* donor who contributed financially to this transformative program.


Merit Pay Rubrics Created & Salary Scales Shared with Faculty ('21/'22)







A Scholar is Reborn

Angry, frustrated, discouraged. Those were the words 7th grader Angelica Macedo used to describe herself before enrolling at the Catholic Academy of Bridgeport this past year.

Having been a "strong student" at a Bridgeport magnet school since Kindergarten, Macedo began finding classes there challenging starting in 6th grade. "My classmates started to give me a really hard time, and many of my teachers were not supportive at all. One even told me that I 'used to be smart' and she didn't know what happened to me, like there was now something wrong with me," she recalled.

Feeling alone and unmotivated, Macedo began having behavioral issues and even received two in-school suspensions. "It was totally unlike my personality," she said.

When Angelica's mom, Angela, came across CAB's St. Ann campus, she told her daughter, "This is the place. We can't say 'no' if they'll accept you." St. Ann Principal Pat Griffin did indeed accept Macedo, while setting some clear parameters. "Mrs. Griffin saw in me what my mom saw — that I am smart, and if I set my mind to something, I can achieve it."

And achieve it she has. This past year, Macedo made the High Honor Roll for the first time, and was chosen by Principal Griffin to attend a Leadership Institute at Fairfield University. "I felt so proud!" Macedo exclaimed. "With the support of everyone at St. Ann, I am working hard and confident I will achieve my dreams."

Recently, one of Macedo's teachers used the word "scholar" in class, and Macedo asked to be called by that moniker going forward "because this is how I see myself today," she said. The teacher readily complied and now refers to Macedo as her "favorite scholar."



"If I knew how amazing CAB was, I would have put Angelica here from the beginning," said Mrs. Macedo. "Angelica has more motivation to get up in the morning, and the teachers here have more patience and make efforts to help students get a better education and be better people. And it's a safe space."

Mrs. Macedo says her daughter is also more caring and attentive since attending St. Ann and more comfortable interacting with other children and sharing her faith. "Every last penny we have spent has been worth it when it comes to the change in Angelica, but financial aid has helped us so much too. I don't have to worry about school costing too much and not being able to cover our other bills and expenses. The school has been a blessing to our family. I pray to God every day that Angelica will continue with a Catholic education one day in high school and for the rest of her life."

Angelica dreams of giving back to her parents what they have given to her. "My mom and dad work very hard for everything my brother and I have. My dad was even injured last year, so it has been tough for him. He goes to work anyway, but it's been tight. If it weren't for financial assistance, I wouldn't be able to come to school here. I'm grateful to those who give so students like me can chase our dreams and benefit from the education and opportunities that happen within the positive, caring and challenging campuses of the Catholic Academy of Bridgeport."

Angela and Heder Macedo are grateful to CAB for helping to change the trajectory of their daughter's life. "Every last penny we have spent has been worth it when it comes to the change in Angelica, but financial aid has helped us so much too," said Mrs. Macedo. •

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



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
