



Welcome Message

As Bishop of the Diocese of Bridgeport and Chair of the Board of the Catholic Academy of Bridgeport, we are pleased to share with you our Annual Report for the 2023–2024 academic year.

The Catholic Academy of Bridgeport continued its vibrant faith-based mission, providing a high-quality education to 888 PreK-8 students this year. Our student outcomes remain extraordinary. Despite leaving us after 8th grade, 100% of our students graduate high school and 99% go onto college or a secondary education of their choice. We owe much of our success to our student families who are fully committed to investing what they can to best educate their children in a city where there are few options.

CAB's financial standing is as strong as ever, recording a balanced budget for the year. This is always a major accomplishment as the vast majority of CAB families live at or below the poverty level and need substantial scholarship funding. This past year CAB underwrote 70% of the cost to educate our students this year, or roughly \$4.5mm of our increasing, and inflation affected, \$7mm budget. Fortunately, we gain support from many different sources and controlling costs is always job number one. A CAB education still costs less than half that of Bridgeport public or charter schools, ensuring that our school is the most efficient pure play

donors can make toward completely changing the lives and hopes of Bridgeport youth on a large scale.

CAB's Success Pay initiative, previously referred to as Merit Pay, concluded its second year. Over the first two years, 11 teachers have successfully completed their portfolios and advanced to their subsequent levels of teacher mastery. They express gratitude for this opportunity and admit that while the process initially seemed daunting, taking the time to reflect on their practice from so many points of view was valuable and ultimately rewarding. Success Pay is the bedrock of CAB's efforts to recruit, develop and retain the best teachers possible and to continue our push to further improve the education we provide.

Thank you for supporting the Catholic Academy of Bridgeport. With the leadership of our executive Director, Angela Pohlen, and our 20-member Board, 4 principals, 54 teachers and 36 other staff members, we will continue to work hard to provide an exceptional, faith-based education for our growing student body.

When I think of our extra-curricular opportunities: our winning basketball teams and other athletics offerings, our chess tournament winners, our Alegre Program for the Performing Arts festivals, our musical and theater productions, our Bible study groups, our dozens of after school enrichment experiences; in every single example of "something more" a principal

or teacher established it, coached it, or moderated it. The superlative experience of our students is directly related to the devotion of the high-quality educators that choose to live out their vocation at the Catholic Academy of Bridgeport. Make no mistake - they can work anywhere - but we are blessed to have them here making the difference in classrooms, stages, and sports courts every day.

And behind each teacher is an army of angels, helping to provide the things they need to do their jobs well. Thank you for being among that number. Thank you for believing in us and for assisting us to bring the type of quality academics and dynamic programming to our students that other schools in Fairfield County take for granted. Our kids deserve it, and they are in wonderful hands: their principals', their teachers', and yours. I hope that as you review this Annual Report, you will be proud of the impact you help us to make in the lives of nearly 900 children and their families. It is a blessing to work in the vineyard with you.

After-Care & Summer Programming - After-care programs were available on three of our campuses, with St. Augustine poised to begin its own after-care program next year. Summer programming was in full swing on all four campuses, including our popular JumpStart enrichment program at St. Augustine, which is open to all CAB 4th-8th grade students.

High School Partnerships - We continued to deepen our relationships with top private high schools so that the 98% of our 8th graders who are accepted into these schools annually have access to the scholarships and financial aid many of them need to afford them. Our students received awards from Cheshire Academy, Fairfield College Preparatory School, Greens Farm Academy, Hamden Hall, Hopkins School, Kolbe Cathedral Prep, Lauralton Hall, Notre Dame Prep of SHU, Sacred Heart Hamden, and St. Joseph High School, among others.

The Arts - Our Alegre Program for the Performing Arts offered drama, dance and choir to students after school. Participants were able to perform live onstage at the end of the semester at the Quick Center for the Arts as well as travel to New York City to see The Wiz. Afterward, they enjoyed a private Q&A with the production stage manager.

Community Building - Students participated in a Tree Lighting Ceremony in Black Rock, marched in the St. Patrick's Day Parade, hosted an Easter Egg Hunt, and held potluck suppers, family bingo and drive-in movie nights. CAB also held Financial Aid Nights to personally assist parents who had questions or needed help with our application process.

STEM Grants - Funding was awarded to CAB for the purchase of Blu Track kits and accessories for our physics lab as well as for an additional 3D printer, printer cart and drones.

The '23/'24 school year was the second full year of Success Pay implementation at CAB and the results remain notable: Teacher turnover remained down, faculty morale remained up and school-wide diagnostic assessments conducted regularly throughout the year showed notable growth for *all* students on *all* campuses in reading, ELA, and math. Faculty continued to feel validated for being evaluated based on their merit rather than their longevity, and teachers only left the Academy due to moves outside of the area and not because of salary. **Industry leaders have taken note and are supporting this transformative initiative, including those shown on these pages.**

Alumnus Phillip Martins, a rising freshman at Yale University and alumni speaker at our May 2024 Golf Classic, explained, "I am proud to say that the work ethic I was taught at CAB's St. Augustine [campus] translated into

me being Summa Cum Laude honors all four years of high school at Fairfield Prep and being accepted into Yale. Words can't even begin to describe how much the Catholic Academy of Bridgeport means to me. They believed in me when I couldn't find it to believe in myself, and sometimes that is all you need: someone to believe in you. I am confident with the support of [donors], they can help other students just like me find the belief in themselves that they need to succeed."



Drawn to More

After attending the Catholic Academy of Bridgeport for PreK, Gabriel Cruz's parents decided to transfer him to a local magnet school, in an effort to save money. But by 3rd grade, Gabriel was back at the Academy, where he "felt happy and cared for. I really missed the feel of being in a Catholic community, and having religion classes and being around people who were really nice and supportive. The teachers and staff here really care."

Now an 8th grader on CAB's St. Augustine campus, Gabe recalls a time when he was in 5th grade and had an issue with another student. "I was crying in my teacher's arms and she was comforting me the whole way. Everything was resolved very quickly. This school gives you that kind of 1:1 attention. We all try to live with a Christ-like manner and be the best version of ourselves."

Gabe strives to be the best version of himself outside of class too. He has been a member of the Boys Varsity Basketball Team for the past three years, and this year is the team's co-caption. "Last year, we won the championships for our division and made it all the way to the Regionals in New Hampshire. It was like playing on another level."

Gabe's mother, Diana, is a CAB alumna and thankful her son has been able to attend the same school she did. Gabe's father, Jonathan, is also grateful. "In the beginning it was tough but we were able to get aid and that made all the difference. We have to spend extra, but we get to avoid a lot of the stuff you find in public schools. [CAB] is more in line with how we live...Plus, I see a mindset in my son he gets from here. He's a problem solver and figures things out. He uses his imagination. I see other kids who don't go here and they can't think



for themselves or have the maturity Gabe has. My son is with his teachers in small classes eight hours a day and it's a game changer."

Jonathan also credits St. Augustine principal Dr. Allison Hurtt for his son's successes. "Dr. Hurtt is at every one of the kids' games. She really gets along with everybody. She's as real as it comes. A lot of these kids don't have dads in their lives or their parents don't speak English well. They have to grow up quickly and may not all have a role model. Dr. Hurtt can play that role because she gets it."

Gabe understands the sacrifice his parents make for him to attend CAB. "My parents work really hard and I know it's a blessing I can go to such a nice school, so I really take advantage of the opportunities I have here. Every summer I go to Camp Pinehurst in Maine through the school and I've had a chance to try archery, water skiing, canoeing, riflery, kayaking. Going there puts me back to nature and there are no electronics. It's just people talking."


Gabe will soon be ready to launch from CAB into the next chapter of his education. "For high school, my dream is to go to Fairfield Prep, Notre Dame or St. Joe's. I'm hoping to get a scholarship and one day use my math and numbers skills in a job. I think this school has made me very ready for my time in high school."


